The pool heating is back on!

Members brave January heat to replace aged solar heating system

After a few years and one last freezing winter, the drips, sprays and gushes became too many, and the solar pool heating system on the roof of the club house had to be replaced.

The outlay required to replace the ribbons of rubber tubing and associated plumbing was considerable. Initially we thought we could make do with the old ribbon. However, it proved to be too brittle and hardened. So after a false-start in early December, we reconvened on Saturday 5 January. ACTNC President Nudo lead a band of brave volunteers onto the roof to rip up the old rubber, and lay the new stuff.

However, even with all-new materials, installation proved to be more challenging than envisaged. The tubes were difficult to connect to the end-pipes. However, a trick was found—the combined use of needle-nosed pliers to pry the tubing open, and a drop or two of the ever-reliable KY jelly to help slide the tubing over the connecting barbs!

With the Hottest 100 Pool Party and Open Day only a few weeks away, there was an added urgency to restore the system and return the swimming pool to a more comfortable temperature. Thanks to all involved in helping with this difficult task—and thanks also to the patience of all members who have had to persist with a cold pool for too long. RP■

In your discussions with me and other committee members, it appears that most of you are more concerned about present-day issues. I take this onboard, because if we can't get to a point where 'Happy Hour' really is a happy hour, then we are not meeting the objectives of the Club – "to offer a relaxed, open and honest approach to nudism".

Interestingly, most of the concerns or suggestions raised relate to issues that are already clearly laid down in our Constitution or our official By-Laws. However, others relate to the 'unwritten rules' about common sense, courtesy, manners, and other things you would generally expect from your housemate, friend or neighbour. Since membership of the Club is open to any person or family interested in nudism who agrees to abide by the Club rules, I would take the opportunity this month to remind you of some of these rules, and other things you can do to make our Club an enjoyable experience for everyone, not just for yourself.

Legal / OH&S obligations

For various legal and safety reasons, please ensure you sign in and out of the visitors' book when arriving and departing the Club.

Security

The members silver padlock and the visitor / probationary green padlock at the front gate must be reset to "0000" after entering or leaving the grounds. When locking up the Club house, the front padlock must be reset to "0000", and the back cipher lock must be locked and cleared by pressing "C".

Safety

Murphy's Law implies that a walk around the fence line could turn into a fall or a snake bite. If you are going to do it alone, please tell someone when you are expected back. We won't go looking for you unless we know you are missing!

Shoe Rack

Recently, shoes and thongs have been left lying around the entrance. Not only is this untidy, it also presents a tripping hazard. We have a shoe rack by the front door - please use it.

Phone

If you wish to make a personal call from the Club's phone, please leave \$0.50 in the honesty box next to the phone.

Swimming Pool

In order to ensure the safety, hygiene and pleasantness of the pool and surrounding areas, here are a few basic rules and guidelines to consider:

We have no lifeguard. A quick swim could easily turn into a drowning, so please think again about swimming when you are the only person in the pool area. If no-one sees / hears you drowning, you will not be resuscitated!

Children under 14 years within the boundaries of the pool fence must be supervised at all times.

Please shower before entering the pool.

The "Welcome to Thullande" pack states that the pool is nude swimming only. Whilst this is a general guideline, it does not apply to children under 18, and in fact babies and toddlers who are not yet fully potty trained must wear bathing nappies whilst in the pool.

Also menstruating women may wear bikini bottoms as appropriate. Swimmers in particular need of sun protection may also wear hats or T-shirts in the pool as necessary. Whilst the nude swimming rule is a general guideline, common sense obviously applies.

Food and drinks may be taken into the pool area (but no glass or china please). Members, visitors and guests should use plastic glasses, plates, bowls, platters etc when in the pool area. In order to prevent people from injuring themselves on broken glass, the official ACT Nudist Club By-Laws state that "No glass item to be taken into the pool enclosure at any time." However, common sense prevails. For example, it is OK to wear sunglasses, watches, etc. A

borderline case is a bottle of wine that is securely stowed inside a suitable bag which is kept on the grassed area. In this case, please use caution when refilling your plastic glass, and put the bottle back into the bag as soon as practicable. Of course, the preferable approach is to leave the bottle in the clubhouse, and make the short trip from the pool to for a recharge.

Please do not sit directly on a communal chair, banana lounge or the pool deck when nude. Use a towel or sarong when sitting or laying nude.

If you bring an umbrella, li-lo, noodles, banana lounge etc into the pool area during the day, please do not leave it there overnight. We often get strong winds at night and have found these items all over the place. Please store these items appropriately.

The opportunity to enjoy Happy Hour by the pool should apply to everyone. Don't forget that your hard-working Committee are Club members too, and would like to come to Happy Hour to relax and chill out just like every one else. Please refrain from bringing up 'official' issues around the pool, particularly if we have visitors or guests present. Let's leave business issues for an appropriate time in the clubhouse, and ensure the pool is a 'fun only area' as originally intended.

Quiet Times

As far as I am aware, we have no written rules for strict quiet but the unwritten rules appear to be:

- Non-function nights: Party Animals – turn the doof-doof down after sunset, be considerate until 10pm, and as Elmer Fudd said, "be berry berry quiet" after that.
- Function nights: Early retirees – please don't complain about the noise even if the party animals continue till the sun comes up. Party animals – please be considerate of others when it gets late.

Bore Water

Most of the water around the grounds is bore water unless clearly marked as "drinking water". Although it comes out of the ground, bore water is not a free resource for the Club. Indiscriminate use of bore water over the past few years has resulted in excessive wear and tear on the pumps, and the subsequent replacement of three complete bores. This has been a significant drain on the Club's limited financial resources, as is the extra cost of electricity to keep pumping up the replacement water.

If you have a van site with a garden or patch of grass, please limit watering to a maximum of once every 2 days and then for no longer than one hour. This will help with the electricity bill and the life of the bore not to mention the water quality, which needs time to settle each day to maintain the quality.

Drinking Water

Our "drinking water" comes from rainwater tanks and is a very limited resource. Please only use "drinking water" for drinking / cooking / dishes etc and not for watering gardens, washing cars etc.

Garbage

We do not have a garbage disposal / collection service at Thullande. Each member or guest is responsible for cleaning and removing their own garbage (food scraps, bottles, cans, cigarette butts

etc). No garbage is to be left in the clubhouse bins.

Clubhouse Rubbish Bins

Rubbish bins are there primarily there for function nights only, where one of your fellow members has selflessly volunteered to take "function" rubbish home.

On function nights we have had trouble separating rubbish from recycling because people have indiscriminately disposed of their personal rubbish into the nearest bin. Please do not use the kitchen bins for your personal rubbish on function nights – bring a shopping bag or a box and take your own rubbish with you.

On non-function days, no-one is scheduled to take the rubbish away. Please do not put anything into the rubbish bins – take your own rubbish with you. In particular, nothing should be placed into empty bins without garbage bags / liners as the rubbish can become a health hazard. Once again, please take your own rubbish home.

The only exception is aluminium cans. We have a can crusher and a bin by the front door, and the Club makes money on these. Other than aluminium cans, please take your rubbish home.

And yes, I am repeating myself on purpose. Please take your own rubbish with you when you leave!

Amenities Block Bin

In response to a letter from a member advising of revised standards in relation to hand towels, please note that we no longer have communal towels in the amenities block and are using disposable paper towels only. We have a bin for these, and its content gets burnt in the clubhouse as required. As such, please do not put anything else into this bin, other than hand towels.

Kitchen Sink

Please wash, dry and put away any crockery or cutlery that you use. Simply washing your coffee cup / plate and leaving it on the dish rack to drain is not enough. The dish rack eventually fills up, and 'someone' has to clear up after 'everyone'.

Fridges

We have two fridges in the kitchen, and they both serve different purposes:

The fridge on the right (next to the sink) is the "official" club fridge, and should only be used for Club items. In general, this means that only Committee members and function catering volunteers should be

accessing this fridge. Please do not store



any personal items in the right hand fridge.

The fridge on the left can be freely used by members / visitors to store personal items. It is an asset provided for your benefit. It also means that no-one is responsible for routinely clearing out that fridge. We have had several instances where produce in the fridge is well beyond the use-by date, but we are reluctant to chuck it in case it belongs to somebody. For example, it could have been frozen previously so the use-by date is irrelevant. We just don't know. However, when it starts to go off the mould spores affect other items in the fridge creating a health hazard. So please, remove your personal stuff from the left fridge after your stay. Alternatively, if you have something useful left over (with a significant use-by date) that you would like to donate to the Club (bottle of sauce, butter, etc), then please put it in the right hand fridge before you leave.

Driving on Club grounds

Our Club's two babies are just over a year old now and are at the walking / running stage. We have also recently had visitors who routinely walked around the Club's boundary, and we had children who went exploring. And don't forget that many of us often partake in the odd beverage or two and attempt to walk back to our vans. For safety reasons, please note that pedestrians have the right of way at all times, in all areas of the Club including roads.

Speed Limit

Apart from the obvious safety issues relating to pedestrians and wildlife, excessive speed also throws up unnecessary dust which ends up in peoples vans, on/in cars or in the pool. On arriving, please use a low gear and drive slowly when going up memorial drive from the gate. The speed limit beyond the fork in the road is a strict 5 km/hr on both the road leading to the clubhouse and the road to the caravan sites.

Photography / Videography

We have several professional / amateur photographers in our midst. You are free to take pictures of scenery and wildlife if there are no people anywhere in the shot. You may take pictures of adults after advising and obtaining the subject's consent, but please ensure that you also have the consent of all the people in the background as well. Pictures taken at the Club are for internal Club use or private collections only, and no photographs containing people can be published in any media whatsoever (web site, magazine, newspaper etc) without a second consent (preferably a signed "Form of Release") from all the people in the shot.

Weapons

No firearms, slingshots, or any dangerous weapons are allowed on club grounds. An exception to the rule is the sport of archery, which can only be practised in the presence of an official instructor and a committee member.

Dogs

Like most nature sanctuaries, dogs are permitted but must be on a leash at all times while on Club grounds. Owners must take full responsibility and clean up after their pets. Pets are not allowed in the clubhouse, pool enclosure, the bunkhouse, or the amenities block.

Permanent Structures

Our official by-laws state that no permanent structures are to be erected privately on club grounds. Since most 'structures' can be relatively quickly removed by the use of an angle grinder at ground level, the definition of 'permanent' is open to interpretation. As such, members contemplating the construction of decks, carports, van extensions etc are to submit their plans to the Committee for approval.

Suggestions / Concerns

Most of the positions on the Committee, apart from mine, require a lot of time and effort to fulfil the routine responsibilities of the role. Your current Committee members all have day jobs and selflessly donate their limited spare time for the benefits of the Club. So if you have a suggestion / concern / complaint etc, please come and talk to me in the first instance to take the pressure off the rest of the Committee. I will ensure the matter is raised at a Committee meeting if necessary.

Newsletter / Website Contributions

The responsibilities of newsletter editor and webmaster are particularly time consuming. A lot of time and energy is spent trying to source material from the Internet and other places to add sufficient content. Please don't forget that it is your club and your newsletter / website, and your contributions are highly sought after. How about sharing your experiences with a couple of paragraphs on that holiday you took, or submitting that funny photo? Got any tips, jokes, puzzles or words of wisdom? How about your favourite barbeque recipe? No matter small your contribution, it will be greatly appreciated.

Helping Out

Please remember, we are not a resort – we are a Club. We have no paid ground keepers, cleaners, maintenance personnel, caretakers, staff, kitchen hands, accountants, engineers, electricians, plumbers, web masters, editors, printers, secretaries, ... etc. Please do what you can for the benefit of the Club.

Canada's 'Naked News' to Broadcast in Spanish, Italian, Korean

TORONTO — If you speak Spanish, Italian or Korean and long to watch your daily dish of news from a disrobed announcer, today is your lucky day.

Toronto-based Naked News, "the program with nothing to hide," announced Thursday that it will expand its foreign-language coverage in an attempt to gain a worldwide audience.

The program, which features nine female anchors reading the news in the nude or stripping as they present their news segments, will now be broadcast in Spanish, Italian and Korean, along with its already available Japanese broadcasts. Naked News President David Warga said the licensing agreements are confidential and could not divulge the names of the local affiliates that will be producing the shows in Milan, Mexico and South Korea.

The multilingual broadcasts will be available online and through mobile providers, as well as on traditional pay-per-view television stations. Naked News TV is currently available on pay-per-view in the U.S., Europe, Australia, Asia and Canada.

The channel gets its information from regular news services and uses professionally trained writers and directors to produce the bulletins of political, business, sport and entertainment news.

Warga said Thursday the company aspires to be an international news organization and that further expansion is planned.

"The original Naked News English version has always focused and presented an international broadcast. Now with the addition of the foreign-language licensees, our intention at Naked News is to be a global media source, much like CNN or BBC World," Warga said. "We have a worldwide audience, but we haven't been able to give them localized

Fight for Your Nude Rights

news until now."

Created by Fernando Pereira and Kirby Stasyna, Naked News first aired online in 1999 and created quite a lot of attention as anchors aired themselves and the news. The web site was popularized mainly by word of mouth and during its height in 2001 was registering 6 million "unique visitors" a month, which was almost two-thirds of the 9 million monthly viewers registered by CNN at the time.

Time magazine proclaimed the online news broadcast "offers the best international coverage this side of the BBC."

"What Time said is true. A lot of people write in and tell us, we came for the nudity, but stayed for the content. And that was always our intention, to grab you with the nudity and then hook you with the content," Warga said.

Two years after NakedNews.com launched, it hopped over to TV with a 45-minute cable television news show on a pay-per-view station. A male version of the show was created during this time but ceased in October 2007 due to a dwindling subscriber base.

In January 2006, Naked News Japan was launched as a joint venture between Naked News owner eGalaxy Multimedia and Sunrise Corp, a seller of goods and services over the Internet. Japanese broadcasting laws prohibited the

presenters to be fully naked, permitting them only strip to their underwear.

The initial success of the show's concept spawned several international imitators including The Daily Flash, a news program on Playboy TV. In 2006, the French Comedie network launched Les Nuz, which features anchors who read the news with only their underwear on. Warga said he is talking to Les Nuz executives about producing an international French language program. Radio Tango, an Oslo, Norway, radio station, once featured stripping female weather readers on its web site. And in 2002, the Czech television network TV Nova launched PocasDicko, a featurette where a nude woman or man gets dressed in clothing appropriate for that day's weather forecast.

The salacious "Naked News" was also recently the subject of a U.K.-funded documentary entitled "Naked News - Backstage".

Warga, who said the network is expanding into other languages because of the market demand for its brand of "infotainment," said Naked News currently has viewers in more than 172 nations, but could not divulge its subscriber base.

"I can't give you the numbers, but I can tell you we're growing more every day and making a substantial amount of money from it," said Warga. "News and nudity is a concept that just works."

102-year-old nude calendar woman to appear on Leno show

Nora hit headlines worldwide in November after she posed for a nude calendar to raise money for the Ancaster Athletic Football Club's children's club.

Requests for TV appearances and interviews flooded in, with Jay Leno at the top of the pile.

Producers have offered to fly Nora, her son and two daughters over to the studios in America, all expenses paid, and even treat them to a few days of sight-seeing.

Son Robert believes they will appear on the show around Easter, with Nora's passport the only thing standing in the way.



He said: "I sent off forms for a passport for her and I've had forms back asking for information about her parents and grandparents. I'm having to go back to the 1800s to find it."

An original calendar girl has been in touch with Nora, and hopes to include the calendar in an exhibition.

Tricia Stewart was one of the original members of the Rylstone Women's Institute in north Yorkshire that inspired the film *Calendar Girls*, and she was played by Helen Mirren in the film.

Robert turned to Tricia when deciding whether his mother appearing on the Tonight Show was a good idea.

Robert said: "I asked if she could put the clock back would she go on and she said go for it, so that gave me the confidence I needed.

"I have friends in Canada and I asked about Jay Leno and the show, and they said they watch him and it's a great show."

Producers from the Graham Norton Show were turned down by Robert, who feared the presenter would ridicule his mother.

New nude laws out

NUDISTS at Middle Head are being warned if they undress outside the legal and designated areas at Obelisk and Cobblers Beach they will face the full force of the law.

The National Parks and Wildlife Service has erected new signs around Middle Head designed to define the gazetted nude bathing areas at the two beaches.

Area manager Marg Bailey said the signs were part of a management plan for Middle Head to address concerns about indecent behaviour in the bush surrounding the beaches.

"They have been designed to spell out where people can bathe nude under the Local Government Act and to make it easier for the police to take action against individuals who are not complying with the regulations."

She told the Daily that random police patrols were operating in the area.

Police say they will prosecute people who carry out offensive, obscene or indecent behaviour in the area.

Middle Head comes under the jurisdiction of Mosman Council, National Parks and Wildlife Service and the Sydney Harbour Federation Trust.

Late last year a partnership agreement was signed between the stakeholders to better manage the problems.

Community concern about behaviour at the beaches has been running high since a man was seen in June masturbating in full view of schoolchildren playing on Middle Head Oval and another man was seen taking photos of children on his mobile phone.

It is also believed that NPWS officers will be trained to police the new regulations.

Ms Bailey said other measures included landscaping, lighting and a community education program, and added that Middle Head has changed significantly in the past 12 months.

"New areas and facilities have been opened to the public which has improved general public access increasing interest in the area."
